

Dr. Wolk- Weiss,

I would like to share my story with others who are considering NAET. Years ago on a beautiful September day I returned from a walk with my two children. My son Brian (2 years old) asked to try a cashew nut. Never thinking it would be a problem, I let him try it and the world we were living in was never the same. He had a severe reaction and our family was devastated to learn he had food allergies.

Of course I immediately called the allergist to schedule an appointment for the kids. Not only was Brian allergic to all nuts and peanuts but, my daughter (5 years old) tested positive for a peanut allergy too! It was then my daughter who was in kindergarten was labeled "the allergy kid" and her self-esteem was crushed from that day on. I felt like there was nothing I could do to no longer protect my children but educate them on the severity of their allergy. So, we lived in constant fear of foods they may come in contact with. Having children with food allergies, I couldn't believe the ignorance of parents who were annoyed that their child could not bring peanut butter snacks to eat in the classroom. Of course, nothing I said could change the situations they were constantly dealing with. I was just the hug they needed at the end of the day after sitting by themselves at the "peanut-free" lunch table feeling left out!

I regret not finding Dr. Wolk-Weiss years ago. I am a parent who when something is wrong goes to the doctor to make it better. But, this time the allergist whom we were seeing seemed to have no answers or help. As the years have passed, our family dealt with many blows. It seemed like food allergies began to control our life. By the time Brian was 9 years old he was allergic to nuts, peanuts, shellfish, seeds, soy, and all fruits and vegetables (even cooked). He also showed a low level wheat and corn allergy that I think caused abdominal discomfort. Not to mention, everything outside. It was impossible to provide him with a healthy diet and let him enjoy the beautiful spring days. I once again called his allergist with my concerns and was told he could do nothing and Brian would have to live with the allergies. This time, I just couldn't accept that answer!

After several days of crying and feeling sorry for ourselves I began to search for answers. I met someone who told me of a "Miracle Man" who was in Boundbrook, NJ. I never heard of NAET or did any form of alternative medicine. I called the office and was very impressed with Dr. Wolk-Weiss from our phone conversation. We soon met and what I liked about him was that he spoke to Brian directly. His age did not matter and for the first time a doctor didn't talk to me as if he was not in the room. From that
